STUDENT PHOTO ID CARDS

WHY BUY AN ASB ACTIVITY DOT?

If you plan to participate in any school organization such as band, drill team, cheerleading, tall flags, all boys' and girls' sports, or student government at Pacifica High School, it is required that you have an ASB activity dot. With the ASB dot you get discounts on many things:

SENIOR PORTRAITS

Seniors should have been contacted directly by Lifetouch Prestige Portraits during the summer regarding senior portraits. If you have not been contacted, please call Lifetouch at 800-436-6198 immediately! Seniors **must** have their senior portrait completed (including proofing and selection) by **October 12** to be included in the yearbook. Lifetouch will select the best picture if past deadline. No senior proofs will be accepted from companies other than Lifetouch.

SCHOOL PICTURES – 9th to 11th GRADES

School pictures for use in the yearbook and for family purchase will be taken on **Wednesday, September 26**. A school picture **make-up day** is set for **Wednesday, October 10**. You are not required to purchase any pictures to appear in the yearbook, however students who miss the school picture dates will not appear in the yearbook. *Additional information will be mailed home regarding picture day.*

STUDENT EMERGENCY CARDS

All students **must** have a completed emergency card in order to enroll in school. Please give close attention to the following:

1. Highlight or otherwise indicate if the home telephone number or address is new.
2. The student's social security number is an important source of identification.
3. It is imperative that the school has the names and daytime phone numbers of **two** people (**other than the parent**) to contact in case of emergency.
4. A pager number or voice mail allows excellent access for leaving messages pertaining to your student at times *other than emergencies*. However, this cannot replace the additional emergency contact numbers.
5. The completion of the back of the card is necessary.

GUIDANCE OFFICE

Students ordered their classes for the 2007-2008 school year last spring. A Master Schedule was constructed to accommodate the student's requests. Students committed themselves to completing the schedule of classes they chose. Counselors will make adjustments, prior to the start of school, for those students who passed summer school classes or need to repeat a class.

In accord with district policy, other schedule changes will only be allowed in the instance of scheduling errors (example: request Algebra 1 and receive Geometry); failure to complete a prerequisite course or requirement; graduation or college/university requirement omitted from schedule; and special programs such as sports, orchestra, band, art, choir, and ROP. For these issues, students can request a change in the Guidance Office. A number will be given to the student at the time of the request and the appropriate counselor will call students out of class or by phone in number order to make the schedule changes.

STUDENT INTERNET CONTRACT

Included in this mailing is a Student Internet Contract which must be completed and returned with your student's registration materials. As we continue to find ways of using the Internet to improve and enhance our curriculum, we must seriously consider all implications. Although we are looking into possible safeguards for students that will negate inappropriate web sites, we must consider the impact of open access to the Internet on our student population. Not only do we ask you to read the contract carefully with your student, but to also look very carefully at the new Internet access and consequences for inappropriate usage in the Discipline Code (included in this mailing). If the student is observed viewing, reading or utilizing Internet material that is inappropriate or inconsistent with district curriculum, disciplinary action will be taken which will include revocation of Internet access privileges.

As a parent and especially for those parents and students with contracts on file, you may request at any time for your student not to participate in hands-on activities using the Internet. If you make such a request, alternative information sources will be made available for your student's use.

This contract does not deny student access to instructional computer use. Please mark the appropriate box and sign the student and parent signature lines and return with all registration materials on the appropriate registration day.

TELEPARENT

Our teachers will continue to use a computer system called Teleparent to increase communication with parents. You may receive an automated phone call in your home language to provide you with classroom information regarding your students. If you have any questions, please contact the office at (714)663-6515.

ATTENDANCE OFFICE PROCEDURES

- Report absences the first day by calling the Attendance Office at **663-6544** after 8:30 a.m.
- For releasing students early (doctor's appointment, etc.), send a note with the student to the Attendance Office before school. Include the student's name, reason, time to be released, and a phone number to reach the parent to confirm the note. The student will then pick up an Off Campus Pass during a passing period.
- Students must obtain a pass through the Attendance Office if they need to leave campus for any reason. Any student leaving without a pass will be considered truant (see Discipline Code).
- Students returning from an absence should have a written excuse or their signed Off Campus Pass on the day they return. This should include the exact date(s) and/or periods covered and the reason for absence.
- Rainy day weather transportation is a problem! Please make arrangements ahead of time as to where and when you will meet your student if it rains. Transportation messages will not be delivered to students. Since the parking lots are so crowded on these days, you might plan to meet on a side street.
- Encourage your student not to bring large amounts of cash (over \$20) or valuables to school. No matter how careful students feel they are, numerous items are reported lost every year. The office will not accept more than \$5.00 in cash to be given to a student. Thank you for your cooperation!
- LOCKERS – Because of our increased enrollment, students must use their assigned lockers. Students sharing lockers or using an unassigned locker will be given Saturday School. Note: the school is not responsible for items left in the lockers or for those items lost or stolen.

ATHLETIC PROGRAM

Athletics is an important part of the total educational experience at Pacifica High School. Research has shown that students who participate in extra-curricular programs have more success in the classroom. All students are encouraged to participate in athletics.

In order to participate in the Pacifica athletic program, student and parent must complete the

Athletic "Clearance Packet." The packets, which are currently available in the Administration Office, include:

1. Physical examination form
2. Insurance waiver and/or purchase form
3. Athletic emergency card
4. CIF Athletic Code
5. PHS Athletic Code/Eligibility form
6. Completion of "Acknowledgement of Risk in Athletics" form (both parent and student must sign form in presence of school official or notary)

In past years, the athletic programs at Pacifica have primarily been funded through the sales of associated student body activity cards (ASB cards). Athletic expenses such as tournament entry fees, official's fees, equipment, supplies, uniforms and facility maintenance costs have been funded through ASB card purchases.

There are many other benefits for the student-athlete who purchases an activity card besides supporting the basic needs of the athletic programs. With an ASB activity card, students will receive considerable discounts to home sporting events, fine arts productions, yearbook and student store purchases as well as school dances.

We are soliciting your help to continue our pursuit for athletic and academic excellence by purchasing an ASB activity card. ASB activity cards will be available during athletic registration and can be purchased at the Bookstore for \$20.00.

Upon completion of the athletic packet, each eligible student will receive an athletic clearance card. STUDENTS MUST HAVE A CLEARANCE CARD BEFORE THEY MAY PRACTICE OR CHECK OUT EQUIPMENT. The athletic directors will be available to issue clearance cards on Friday, August 17 and Monday, August 20 from 9:00 to 12 Noon. Acknowledgement of Risk forms can be witnessed by the Athletic Directors on clearance days or brought to the school office for signing between the hours of 7:30 to 12 Noon and 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. *Students not competing in Fall Sports may turn in Clearance Packets to the Athletic Secretary (Mrs. Cutler in the Attendance Office) any time prior to the start of their season.*

The academic eligibility criteria for participation in the athletic program consists of passing four (4) or more classes with an overall grade point average of 2.0 on a 4.0 grading scale for the preceding quarter of study. Academic eligibility is required and computed for each quarter of the school year.

STUDENT INSURANCE

General coverage insurance is available to all students. A letter explaining the coverage is included in this package. If insurance is desired, have your students pick up an insurance packet from the Administration Office during registration.

Insurance or a signed waiver is required for athletic and/or performing groups. The general student insurance will meet all requirements except for football. Boys participating in football must have football insurance or a signed waiver meeting the required coverage.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION DEPARTMENT

State law requires that clothes worn in P.E. classes be different from those worn in other classes in order that P.E. clothes are distinguished from school apparel. Please assist us in our efforts to ensure that all students wear uniform clothing to the P.E. classes. Pacifica P.E. uniforms may be purchased for \$16.00/set or shorts \$9/shirt \$9. Plain gray or blue sweats may be substituted. P.E. locks may be purchased for \$6.00 each. P.E. locks and clothes will be sold at registration (checks payable to PHS).

PHS MEDICATION POLICY

Medical treatment is the responsibility of the parent(s) and family physician. Medications, both prescription and over-the-counter, are rarely given at school - the only exceptions involve special or serious problems where it is deemed absolutely necessary by the physician that the medication be given during school hours.

Students may not carry or take prescription or over the counter medication at school without the following GGUSD, OCDE and California Ed Code procedures being followed: a written statement signed by the licensed physician; a signed request from the parent/guardian; medication must be delivered to the school by the parent or other responsible adult in the original, labeled pharmacy container, and a separate form for each medication. The OCDE (Orange County Department of Education) form is available from school and local medical offices. Medications are kept in the nurse's office except for inhalers or EpiPens, which may be carried by Pacifica students after approval is received. Any student with a serious health problem should also consider keeping an emergency, three-day supply of medicine at school in case of disaster.

If the above requirements have not been met, only the **parent or guardian** may come to school and physically hand their child the necessary medication. Thank you for following the proper procedure. The safety and welfare of Pacifica students is our foremost concern. If you have any questions about the medication policy, please contact the nurse, Mrs. Apodaca, at 663-6544. She is usually on campus Mondays and Wednesdays.

PACIFICA HIGH SCHOOL SPECTATOR POLICY

The California Interscholastic Federation has in place a code of ethics that embodies the spirit of high school athletics. Based on the CIF guidelines, Pacifica High School has developed the following Spectator Policy that will be enforced at all Pacifica High School athletic events.

1. All persons must remain in the designated home spectator area at all times while the contest is in progress. This includes time-outs, quarters, half-time, etc.
2. All spectators must stay off the floor during the game, quarters, time-outs, and half-time.
3. Only positive comments, signs/posters, cheers will be addressed to any participant within the athletic venue, including visiting teams, visiting fans and referees.
4. No mechanical noisemakers (horns, bells, victory bells, sirens, chimes, musical instruments other than those in the band) will be permitted inside the gymnasium. Penlights, laser lights or any type of lighting device are prohibited in the gymnasium.
5. No throwing of any objects onto the gymnasium floor or at another spectator.

Any deviation from this policy could result in, but is not limited to:

**Removal from the contest

**Non-attendance at future contests

PACIFICA DRESS STANDARDS

Garden Grove Unified School District Board of Education expects students enrolled in district schools shall present themselves in a manner conducive to study and educational advancement. A student's personal grooming and dress should be neat, clean and appropriate for the demands of the activities in which the student is participating. Parents assert a major responsibility for their student's appearance, not only in providing the clothing, but also in guiding the

student in the selection and wear of appropriate school apparel. The principal is responsible for deciding questions of appropriateness of a student's dress at the local school site.

The dress and grooming of students in every case shall be neat and clean and will:

- Cause neither actual distraction nor disturbance to a school activity.
- Create neither a health nor a safety hazard to themselves or others.
- Invade the rights of others.

Following are items of apparel and accessories which are inconsistent with Pacifica's dress standards and which may not be worn by students:

UNACCEPTABLE APPAREL

- Bare midriff: Tops and shorts/pants/skirts must meet with no bare skin showing. Jackets/shirts tied around waist to cover bare skin will not be accepted.
- Halter top/underwear style tops, tops with low necklines and strapless tops.
- Any clothing that allows undergarments to be exposed.
- Torn or tattered or dirty clothing.
- Excessively oversized pants (not more than two sizes above student's waist size); waistband of pants must be worn above hipbone; belts must be worn; pant legs are not to drag the ground.
- Overalls with tops hanging down; straps must be over shoulders.

UNACCEPTABLE SYMBOLS/SLOGANS ON CLOTHING OR ACCESSORIES THAT:

- Show drugs, alcohol, tobacco, sex, violence, gangs, weapons, profanity, and/or criminal activity.
- Degrade cultures, ethnic values, religion, gender.

UNACCEPTABLE ACCESSORIES/GROOMING

- Chains
- Hairnets, gang oriented paraphernalia, etc.
- Dangling belts
- Bandanas, belt buckles or jewelry with gang initials, name or insignia
- Colored hair or hair style that causes a distraction or disturbance at school or in the classroom
- Dog collars or bracelets or jewelry with spikes.
- Any item of clothing and any accessory that reflects gang affiliation or gang identity by virtue of its colors, trademarks or other design arrangements.
- Any other apparel or accessory that causes a distraction or disturbance that can create a health or safety hazard.

Parents, we are requesting your support in maintaining high, consistent dress standards. If students come to school wearing clothing that does not meet our standards, students will be referred to the Attendance Office; garment will be changed and replaced by a school T-shirt. The school T-shirt must be returned at the end of the day to collect the original garment. If any inappropriate accessory item is worn or brought to school, the item will be confiscated and returned later to the parent.

By working together, we can promote an orderly school environment and a safe instructional atmosphere for our students. Thank you for your cooperation and assistance in encouraging high standards of personal attire and grooming.

PARKING PROCEDURES

Parking is a privilege extended to Seniors and Juniors only. Students need a parking permit to park in the East (Senior) and West (Junior) Lot. Students are to park in numbered spaces only and parking is on a first come first serve basis. Seniors and Juniors may apply for a parking permit through the Bookstore. The Faculty Lot is for staff parking only. The parking lots are monitored daily.

STUDENT DROP-OFF/PICK-UP PROCEDURES

Students who receive a ride to school must be dropped off and picked up in the East (Senior) or

the **West (Junior) Lot**. This procedure is in effect for all starting and release times. We have Campus Security personnel to assist with on site traffic flow and whenever possible a GGPD traffic officer will assist with traffic congestion.

It is our goal to achieve a safe and more efficient drop-off and pick-up system for our school community. Every effort is being made to accomplish this for our growing student population and we are continuing to work with our District Office and the Garden Grove Police Department to improve traffic flow. We ask that parents please obey all traffic laws and school procedures for student drop-off.

PICK-UP PROCEDURES FOR STUDENTS ATTENDING ACTIVITIES
